Note:

- § This is a valuable experience for DREs, RE Committee members, RE teachers, Congregational leaders, Youth Advisors and Ministerial Students. You'll be sharing and learning with a group of folks passionate about supporting and developing a variety of enriching UU Identity learning experiences with children, youth, young adults and intergenerational community, and addressing our overall theme of the Annual Conference and Meeting, "Getting to know UU!"
- § You must stay for the whole module (Thursday 9 am – 9pm, Friday 9 am – 4pm) to receive credit. Accommodation booked is for Wed and Thursday nights. This is an all-inclusive price, subsidized by the CUC LL office and no discount is given for those arriving Thursday morning in time for the module.
- § These are intensive and participatory learning experiences including 15 hours of required program time. If module is cancelled due to lack of enrollment, you will be notified three weeks in advance and your payment will be returned promptly.
- § Come prepared to share in small group planning and presentation of a learning activity for the larger group. You are welcome to bring any readings, materials or resources that you especially like and that speak to you of UU Identity (CDs or tapes, instruments, books, pictures, candles, chalices...) Materials and a resources box will also be available on site. There are lovely grounds at the University however we are not at a U*U church site.
- § You are also invited to bring any samples of identity focused worship services, curriculum, copies of multigenerational events, social justice projects or outreach programs that you have developed or used..

Enough copies for participants are certainly appreciated! A participant list will be sent prior to the module.

Lodging:

We will be staying on site at McMaster University, in 4 bedroom suites at a Mary Keyes residence and arrangements will be made on your behalf. Each participant will have a bedroom (single bed) with a door; suites include shared bathroom for 2 bedrooms, kitchenette and common living room - it is like a small apartment. The module training will take place in the residence hall as well, in a windowed common room on our floor and we have access to smaller break out rooms, as well as the living rooms in our suites for small group work and abundant green space outdoors. We will go to a lovely dining room on campus for our Thursday evening dinner break. Note: Those participants registering and staying on for the CUC ACM will need to make their own arrangements for ACM accommodations. This suite residence is guaranteed for the Renaissance Module time only, Wednesday and Thursday nights.
